TRUE LOVE

The word "love" is used many times in various ways every day in our lives and society. But we surely understand that the "love" we have for our husband, wife and children is different than the "love" we have for ice cream and cake. And with that knowledge comes responsibility. With loving my wife/husband comes the responsibility to "love, honor and cherish until death do us part". With loving our children comes the responsibility to "train up a child in the way he/she should go". Although I don't think we always live up to those responsibilities, and we all should strive to improve in them daily, no one would deny the reality of them.

The same is true of our love for each other as the family of God. No one can deny the clear command from God to love each other: *"We love because he first loved us. If anyone says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen. And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother"* (1 John 4:19-21). So the command is clear – we are to love each other. But with the love comes responsibility. The Bible tells us **true love** forgives, comforts, encourages, blesses, extends grace and mercy, thinks of others before self, mourns and rejoices.

Life is too short to go through life with conflict among those we should love. God tells us that relationship "mending" should take precedence even over your being here to worship Him this morning. *"So when you offer your gift to God at the altar, and you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there at the altar. Go and make peace with that person, and then come and offer your gift"* (Matthew 5:23-24).

Eben's Essentials

Have you ever thought about living alone in a cabin in the woods reflecting on nature and the deeper issues of life? Back in 1845, Henry David Thoreau did. He built a small cabin in the woods, next to Walden Pond, near Concord, Massachusetts. He lived there for two years, two months and two days. He famously wrote about it in his book, Walden. Several years ago our family visited Concord and stood on the site where Thoreau's cabin had been.

In a passage in Thoreau's book he wrote, "Sometimes, in a summer morning, having taken my accustomed bath, I sat in my sunny doorway from sunrise to noon, rapt in a reverie, amidst the pines and hickories and sumachs, in undisturbed solitude and stillness, while the birds sang around or flitted noiseless through the house."

The psalmist in the Bible apparently had a similar attitude. When I read the above quotation, I thought of Psalm 19:1-2: "The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky proclaims the work of His hands. Day after day they pour out speech; night after night they communicate knowledge."

Nature has a profound message!
