Richard's Reflections

Love Each Other

"But when the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees with his reply, they met together to question him again. One of them, an expert in religious law, tried to trap him with this question: "Teacher, which is the most important commandment in the law of Moses?" Jesus replied, "'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments" (Matthew 22:34-40).

There are countless passages that teach the above principle of the necessity of Christians loving each other and those who are around them. We certainly all agree with Jesus and enjoy the fact that He loves us, in spite of our faults and failures. Yet, when it comes to putting this into practice and actually being like Jesus and doing what He says....that's often a different story. How many are the stories we have heard about churches splitting, dividing and fighting over opinions? Where is the love in this?

We are not always going to agree on all things...even important matters we may see differently. The apostle Peter said in 2 Peter 3:16 there are some difficult things in Scripture and some even "hard to understand". We may not see "eye to eye" on every doctrinal matter but if we are united in Jesus (Romans 6:5) and we follow His example of loving each other, we should learn that we can disagree without being disagreeable and that every disagreement doesn't have to lead to division. Take time to read Romans 14. These brethren disagreed on some things that were very important to them. Paul's advice: "do not argue over matters of opinion" (14:1).

The love of Christ should be clearly seen in His people and His church. We will never truly "shine as lights" until the love of Jesus dominates our hearts!

When Jesus lived on the earth, racism separated Jews and Samaritans. In fact, Jewish travelers customarily detoured well east of Samaria to avoid contact with the despised people. But, Jesus did not do this. When He travelled north from Judea to Galilee, He took the shortest route—right through Samaria. On one trip, Jesus stopped at Jacob's well in Samaria and asked a Samaritan woman for a drink of water. He engaged her in a serious conversation. It was unheard of for a Jewish man to engage in dialogue with a Samaritan woman

(John 4).

God sent Jesus for the salvation of the world. Racial prejudices and ethnic hostilities are crushed by the all-encompassing love of God. His invitation is extended to all people. Racial favoritism and ethnic superiority carry no weight in the kingdom of God. Unfortunately, societal prejudices often permeate the church. This should not be the case.

It would be good for us to examine our own thoughts, outlook and actions. How healthy it is to study and apply the implications found in Genesis 1:27, "So God created people in His own image; God patterned them after Himself; male and female He created them."
