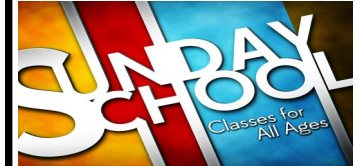

Richard's Reflections

Turning a Little Into a Lot

There is certainly nothing wrong with big dreams! As a matter of fact we all ought to have a little “dreamer” in us. Where would this world be without big dreamers? The Wright brothers dreamed of a “flying machine”, Thomas Edison dreamed of “lighting” the world, and Alexander Graham Bell envisioned being able to “ring up” a friend! Big dreamers can accomplish big things as long as they do more than dream!

Big dreams are great but sometimes we get caught up thinking that big dreams and big deeds are the only things that amount to anything. Our problem is that we think the things that impress men are the same things that impress God. Yet, God is also pleased when we do the things that don't seem so big to others. Very few, I'm sure dream of giving a cup of cold water to someone who thirsts, but God recognizes that effort and says the one who does such shall not lose his reward (**Mark 9:38-41**).

We read about a man named Andrew in **John 1:40**. He would become one of Jesus' disciples and was the brother of the apostle Peter. Did Andrew ever write any of the books of the New Testament? Did Andrew ever preach a noteworthy sermon? Did Andrew ever perform some great deed that caused men to sit up and notice? Nope! But there is an amazing thing about Andrew. It seems like every time his name is mentioned in Scripture it is in connection with him bringing someone to Jesus. Whether it was his brother in **John 1:41** or the little boy with the lunch in **John 6** or the Greeks in **John 12:20-22**. He simply brought them to Jesus knowing that God can do so much with so little.

Those events may have seemed insignificant to men, but God turned those little events into a lot! That little boy's lunch eventually fed 5,000 hungry men and their families. And Andrew's brother Peter, you might recall preached the first gospel sermon in **Acts 2** where 3,000 became Christians in a single day!

No, Andrew never did any great thing...he just did what he could, with what he had, right where he was and He trusted God...to turn a little into a lot!
