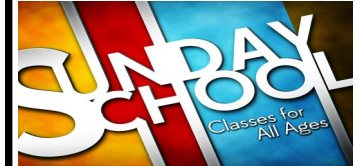

Richard's Reflections

The Gift of the Holy Spirit

The presence of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer is a doctrine that we cannot afford to neglect. We will do so to the peril of our own souls and to the unity of God's family. Without the presence of the Spirit of God, there is no telling what Richard O'Connor is capable of—and the same is true of you. Until we get ourselves out of the way and let the Spirit of God control our lives, we will always be in a mess.

The Holy Spirit is the gift of God that has been given to all baptized believers in Christ (Acts 2:38; 1 Cor. 6:19-20). He is the one who is the energy source and animator of all that the church is and does. Great danger is caused by men who do not have the spirit of Christ. God's word says so. Jude spoke of some evil men and said that they separate themselves from us because they do not have the Spirit (Jude 19). One of the biggest lies we can believe is that the Holy Spirit is not within us, or if He is, He isn't doing anything for us. The only way He could be our "Helper" would be by His helping us!

We need the help of the Holy Spirit to be all that God wants us to be. We need more than a dormant visitor, but an active source of power so that we can be "strengthened" by the Spirit's might in the "inner man" (Eph. 3:16). Make no mistake, the Holy Spirit is active. He does things personally. "For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, 'Abba, Father.' The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God" (Rom. 8:15-16). Notice that the Spirit "Himself" does this.

According to Romans 5:5, the Holy Spirit has flooded our hearts with God's love. Paul also sums it up by saying that who ever does not have the Spirit does not belong to Him (Rom. 8:9).

How do we know who has the Spirit and who does not? Those who have been baptized into Christ where the Spirit is received (Acts 2:38) and whose lives are characterized by the fruit of the Spirit. That fruit is described by Paul in plain terms: love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control (Gal. 5:22). These are the first things we should look for in identifying the faithful in Jesus.

Eben's Essentials

What do the following descriptions have in common? "A flat-Headed insipid, nauseating illiterate charlatan." "Empty verbiage put together in statements which are absolutely empty." "He has no talent for disentangling things." The common element is that, taken in context, they are all examples of backbiting.

Thomas Aquinas, the thirteenth century philosopher-theologian, defined backbiting as "denigration of a neighbor's reputation by means of secret words." Aquinas argued that we might wound a person by words in one of two ways: openly and to his face (that is by insulting him) and secretly, when he is absent-and that is back biting. For Aquinas, backbiting is what Catholics call a mortal sin, akin to adultery and murder. Interestingly, public intellectuals are among the greatest backbiters in history. For example, famous philosopher Ludwig Wittgenstein remarked to a mutual acquaintance that Cambridge philosopher, G.E. Moore, who was Wittgenstein's teacher and benefactor, "showed how far a man can go who has absolutely no intelligence whatever."

In Acts 21 and 22, Paul's enemies, tried to stir up the people against him by accusing him of despising Israel, the Law and the Temple. They claimed that Paul was not fit to live. That was backbiting at its rankest.
