Maybe you remember from last week's lesson on the importance of the Holy Scriptures, I encouraged us to spend five to fifteen minutes a day in reading our Bibles. I know when some people hear that they may ask, "Can I gain anything really valuable reading for just five minutes per day?" And the answer to that is, "absolutely you can!"

Think about it:

- Five minutes a day, seven days a week for a year adds up to over **30 hours!!** Think of the value of spending that many hours in the word of God each year. **FYI** devoting 15 minutes per day of reading equates to 91 hours each year.

- Five minutes may not make a difference with some things, but the word of God is so powerful it can help transform your thinking in a short time. *"God's word is alive and powerful and is sharper than a double-edged sword. It cuts all the way into us, where the soul and the spirit are joined, to the center of our joints and bones. And it judges the thoughts and feelings in our hearts"* (**Hebrews 4:12**).

- Five minutes a day spent in the most important and most powerful book in the world can change our lives! This one book reveals to us the nature and character of God, the love of Jesus for every person, and the power of the Spirit who dwells in every believer!
- Can you spare five minutes every day? It may just change your life!
