Eben's Essentials

When two people get married they bring themselves, their own backgrounds, and their own personalities into the marriage relationship. In a sense, marriage is a "dumping ground" for problems acquired in other aspects of their lives.

The eminent psychologist, Dr. Albert Ellis, thinks that irrational (i.e., self-defeating) beliefs are the basis for faulty interactions in marriages. He says that some of the basic unrealistic beliefs which mates have that upset marriages can be listed under five categories: (1) The dire need for love and approval. This is the idea that it is a dire necessity for a person to be approved and loved by his or her mate for almost everything. (2) Perfectionism in achievement. This is the belief that either partner is utterly worthless if he or she is incompetent in any way. (3) A philosophy of blame and punishment. This is the idea that one should severely blame oneself and the other for mistakes and wrongdoings, and this policy will prevent future mistakes. (4) Catastrophizing frustrations. This is the notion that it is awful and horrible when things are not the way one would very much like them to be. (5) The belief that emotion is uncontrollable. This is the supposition that unhappiness is always externally caused and we are mere "victims."

As fellow believers in the truth of the Christian worldview, I refer you to three Biblical passages: Proverbs 23:7; Romans 12:2; Philippians 4:8.

Today's Wonders will be about trusting God just like Noah did. "God asked Noah to do a pretty outrageous thing. We assume that Noah's ark-building binge brought more than a few snickers from his neighbors. But God had made a covenant with Noah. A covenant is a two-way street, and Noah was determined to keep his end of the bargain.

Sometimes *Christian kids who live in a secular society feel that God asks them to do some pretty hard things, too.* Like returning good for evil. Walking away when test or homework answers are illicitly offered. Loving their enemies. And being faithful to their promises.
