Eben's Essentials

One of the greatest joys and gravest responsibilities of life is the role involved in parenthood. The mother as homemaker is an ecologist in the supremely important area of conservation, the family. The same could be said of the father.

The system of therapy called Transactional Analysis tells us that all children need "strokes." This means receiving love and good feelings from parents. Every child needs an abundance of unconditional positive strokes. For example, they need strokes that express the idea, "I'm glad you're *you* just because you're *you*." They also need positive conditional strokes such as, "If you get your room cleaned up regularly, I'll be happy and you'll get your allowance." This kind of conditional stroke helps develop good habits and manners. However, I believe the unconditional strokes had best take precedence. Enough of the right kind of strokes at the right time helps develop within the child the healthy attitude, "I'm OK. You're OK."

It's also necessary when appropriate for parents to administer fair, consistent, and loving discipline to their children. It's always valuable for parents to heed the Lord's admonition to parents in Ephesians 6:4, "...don't stir up anger in your children, but bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord."

Today's Wonders will be about believing that God will guide us like He did Abraham.

"The cultural distractions Abraham faced pale in comparison to what kids face today. From the moment they wake in the morning until they click off their stereos at night, kids are bombarded with sophisticated messages from a culture that wants to convince them that material possessions and self-gratification bring happiness. In the midst of this media melee, how can kids learn to hear the quiet voice of God?"

Typically our attention turns to God when we face a crisis. Natural disasters, financial problems, the serious illness of a loved one – all these things can call our attention away from the busyness of life and cause us to take a long look at our priorities and values. But it's even harder for children to think of how daily events impact their lives as a whole. Use this lesson to teach kids that life is a series of choices and that when they choose to stop and listen to God, God will always guide them toward the right choices."
