Sensitivity to another's feelings indicates empathy. It most often expects nothing in return. It springs from a kind heart. Empathy is the use of one's imagination to project another's life into our own.

It's terribly easy to hear or even personally employ statements like, "I've learned how it is to get dragged into somebody's life," and "I try not to be open as much in order to protect myself," and "It is hard enough trying to live my own life." Reluctant confessions of selfishness may follow early assertions of empathy. Even though some of us may recognize our lack of a trusting empathetic heart, most of us know for sure that we need one.

I'm pretty certain that all of us, as Christians, would benefit from following the Bible's teaching found in Romans 12:10-13, "Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves. Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality."

Today's Wonders will be about being peacemakers.

"A lot of Christian kids grow up thinking it is wrong to get angry. But the truth is, anger is a healthy human emotion. Depending on the cause of the anger, there's often nothing wrong with getting angry. But there is something wrong with expressing our anger in ways that hurt people - including ourselves. Interestingly enough, it also appears to be just as harmful in the long run to try to stifle and deny anger as it is to vent it in rage."

Today our kids will explore the consequences of expressing anger irrationally as well as the dangers of bottling it up until it cannot be contained. They will learn positive ways of bringing peace to difficult situations and learn from the example of Abraham.

Some tips for being a peacemaker:

- Stop and count to 10
- Think about how the other person feels
- Think of ways to compromise
- Trust God for the results
