Eben's Essentials

Jesus' counsel in the Sermon on the Mount is: Don't worry about things – food, drink, and clothes. For we already have life and a body – and they are far more important than what to eat and wear. Jesus asks: Will all our worries add a single moment to our lives?

So it's not helpful at all to worry about having enough food and clothing. Being appropriately concerned is not the same as worrying, which implies "spinning our wheels" mentally and emotionally. It also implies a lack of trust in the Lord, and a tendency to live regretfully in the past or anxiously in the future instead of in the present. Jesus advises us to not be like the heathen who take pride in all these earthly things and are deeply concerned and preoccupied with them. He reminds us that our heavenly Father already knows perfectly well that we need them, and He will give them to us if we give Him first place in our lives and live as He wants us to live.

Christ wisely teaches us in Matthew 6:34, "Therefore don't worry about tomorrow because tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."
