Eben's Essentials

Our culture appears to be wobbling uncontrollably out of balance. Everywhere we turn, institutions, individuals, and societies are characterized by discord. These conflicts – political, social, religious, racial, ideological- seem to be fueled by extremism. The extremists come in many guises, however, they all appear to share similar tendencies: intolerance of other view points, reluctance to practice moderation, and refusal to acknowledge the intrinsic worth, value and dignity of other human beings.

The antidote to the extremism -which causes so much chaos - is the reasoned **moderation** of the *Christian worldview*. The teachings of Jesus map a route from confusion to order, a way of reason and hope from the eternal wisdom of the New Testament. Moderation and its companion terms such as temperance, restraint, and self-control suggest a lack of extremism and excess that promotes balance and peace in individual and corporate lives.

A good example in Scripture is found in Proverbs 25:28: "Whoever has no rule over his own spirit is like a city broken down without walls." Another good example is in Proverbs 16:32: "He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit than he who takes a city."
