Easter Service Considerations

Easter Sunday is next week. It is usually the best attended Sunday of the year. I'm praying that God will bless our assembly with friends, family, former members, those looking for a church home and those who are searching for Jesus! I just wanted to give us a few courtesies to think about EVERY week but especially next week.

1. **Pray as you enter the parking lot.** Pray for the guests. Pray for the services. Pray for the message.
2. **Park at the most distant spot available.** Save the closer parking places for guests.
3. **Greet people.** They may be guests. They may be members. It's okay to introduce yourself to either.
4. **Look for people to help.** You know the place well. Many others will not. Be a guide. Help someone who looks like he or she needs help.
5. **Sit as close as possible to the front** of the auditorium. Save the back rows for guests and late entrants, so they don't have to walk past so many people.
6. **Sit in the middle.** Don't claim that aisle seat where people have to walk over you or past you.
7. **Sit closely.** Our building is already becoming full—so sit a little closer to each other.
8. **Volunteer to serve.** Volunteer to help where you can next week, and every week. Our "Wonders" children's worship needs volunteers. Be in the parking lot next Sunday and help people find a spot to park, greet them and show them the entrances.
9. **Pray as you leave.** The Holy Spirit of God is likely working in many persons who attend. Pray for His continual work of conviction and comfort.

These are simple acts. They are acts of service. And if you survive doing these acts of kindness and service on Easter, you just might be able to do them on other days of worship as well.

Eben's Essentials

One of the most important aids to a good marriage is communication. Almost certainly, in any marriage with serious problems, meaningful communication is at a low level. One sure means of halting effective communication is the marital game of "uproar." This involves the slamming of doors, screaming and hollering. The outcome is usually hostility, resentment, and bitterness. The possibility of genuine communication is shut off. Another communication-stopper is when one of the partners takes refuge in silence. This has the advantage of appearing to make the silent one the injured one. The use of the "martyr ploy" can quickly halt communication.

Probably, the virtue most necessary in securing the happiness of unity in marriage is *loyalty*. In fact, the sin of infidelity is a valid reason for divorce and remarriage (Matthew 5:32). Less obvious, but also dangerous, is the practice of disparaging one's mate by a raising of the eyebrows, an ironic glance after a simple remark, or being hypercritical of the other's opinions, clothes, and appearance. Disloyalty is also expressed by marital partners who unfavorably discuss their mates behind their backs, especially with persons of the opposite sex.

It would be good for husbands and wives to cultivate the habit of talking through problems. In fact, talking out problems in an honest, calm, non-blaming way is the cornerstone of a successful marriage.
