**Which Gospel are you Trusting?**

In some of his opening statements to the Book of Romans, Paul tells us that the Gospel is the "power of God" (1:16). The word translated "power" comes from a word that refers to the "**might, energy, force and strength that dwell within God.**" There is power in the gospel. The power does not depend on plans, programs or preachers. It depends entirely on God. It is His power that is at work within us (Eph. 3:20).

Paul said that his message was simply the "gospel of Christ." We should all be aware that there are many different "gospels" being preached in our day (cf. Gal. 1:6-9). There is the **gospel of religion** that says, "Do the best you can and God will handle the rest." There is the **gospel of legalism** that says, "Perform well and God will respond by saving you." There is the **gospel of materialism** ("prosperity" gospel) that says, "Your worth is determined by what you have. God's will for you is to be rich and healthy all the time." There is the **gospel of liberalism** that says "I'm OK and you're OK. God accepts us like we are and will take us to Heaven if Heaven really exists. We'll make God our disciple and tell Him what we are going to do rather than listening to what He wants." There is the **gospel of society** that says, "Do as you please for life is short."

Paul's message, on the other hand, says, "You are a sinner, and if you die in your sins, you will be lost eternally. However, God loves you and sent His Son, the Lord Jesus, into the world. Jesus died for your sins and rose from the dead. If you will place your faith in Him - trust in His performance and understanding rather than your own - then you can and will be eternally saved."

Why do some people speak of a conflict between science and religion? The truth is that most of the advances of science have no bearing whatever upon the truths of Christianity, anymore than do the advances of music theory on the game of baseball.

There are, of course, some alleged conflicts. We may discover that the conflicts are smaller and less important than they have grown to be in some people's imagination. For instance, there is the old controversy over whether the sun goes around the earth or the earth around the sun. Medieval theologians displayed a lack of knowledge on this point and were wrong. The Bible, for its part, makes no pretense of speaking on this subject. If it speaks of the sun "rising and setting," so do we all today. If the Bible speaks of "the four corners of the earth," so do we today. These are common expressions which are not meant to be taken literally. We often use figurative language in our spoken and written communication, and so did the Biblical writers.

The whole conflict may have its roots, not in this particular conflict or that, but in radically different views of the world. The believer holds that there is a spiritual realm which transcends the physical realm while the naturalistic scientist may completely reject the possibility of the supernatural (II Cor. 10:3-4).
