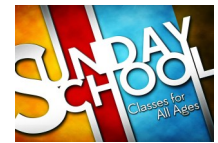

Richard's Reflections

The Lord's Memorial

Although the Bible mentions several memorials that the Lord approved, there is one memorial that reigns supreme over all others. We call it the Lord's Supper or communion. This memorial was instituted by Jesus Himself in Matthew 26:26-28. Let's study 3 things about the Lord's memorial:

I. The Lord's Memorial and My Past

"For this is my blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins" (Matthew 26:28). Other memorials typically remember the past (now that's important) but this memorial of Jesus represents that which forgives the past (Jer. 31:34). It's almost as if we come to remember the fact that God has forgotten (our past!)

II. The Lord's Memorial and My Present

"Take, eat, this is my body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of me...This cup is the new covenant in My blood, this do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me" (1 Cor. 11:23-26). Notice the commands to "do this" and "this do". This is indicating present tense, this is something we are to be doing today! When we eat the supper we are to remember Him! We are to remember His death, His sacrifices, His body, His blood and His grace! Let the Lord's Supper ever be about JESUS and what He has done and is doing for us!

III. The Lord's Memorial and My Future

"For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till he comes" (1 Cor. 11:26). The Lord's death is never to be forgotten. It is to be proclaimed through this event and the preaching of the Good News of Jesus Christ. What this memorial represents is upon which we rest our eternal future. We sing, "My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness". How true! As Christians, you and I are going to heaven. Our future is secured - not by what we have done but by what Jesus accomplished for us at Calvary. And it is this truth we remember each time we partake of the Lord's Memorial!

Eben's Essentials

An ancient worldview with a modern application is pantheism. This eastern religion/philosophy believes that reality is merely one spirit (or "force" - I refer you to the Star War movies). There are no beings or things in the universe. All is one. Consequently, there are no values, no purpose, and no meaning to life. There is also no suffering. All things are an unchanging oneness. All else is an illusion. Practitioners are fond of saying that all is divine. In the eastern part of the world, Hinduism and Buddhism are pantheistic. A modern version in the West is the New Age movement.

It seems likely that western culture's increasing interest in pantheism is, in part, due to dissatisfaction with naturalistic and atheistic explanations for reality and human nature. People find it impossible to live as if there is no value or meaning in who they are and as if there is no purpose for living. The Christian worldview believes in a personal God who is the creator of heaven and earth and all their inhabitants, and who has entered the world of human beings in the form of Jesus Christ.

A great flaw in the pantheistic worldview is that by its own admission it passes no test of evidence or logic since it views the world and self-reflection as unreal. Therefore, this worldview becomes unlivable.
