- Jesus once said, "Whatever you've done for the least of these, you've done for me" (Matthew 25:40).

- Continually think about those whom you love and how they best understand your love for them. **Don't** make the mistake of thinking the way you understand love is automatically the same way they do.
- Work at being fluent at all the love languages (serving, giving gifts, quality time, encouraging words and physical touch). This way you will always be prepared to show your love for others in a way they will understand.
