#### **Eben's Essentials**

I think it is safe to say that something is wrong with western civilization. What causes such decadence in a people? At the risk of sounding simplistic, my basic answer is: Ideas have consequences. There are anti-God ideologies that make up much of the "modern temper." These ideas account for much of the decadence in the status quo. Humans are the only creatures on earth that live by ideas as well as instincts. In human societies, most behavior is transmitted by education, not heredity.

Apparently, God highly values ideas. Solomon said a man becomes on the outside what he thinks on the inside (Prov.23: 7). God contradicted the notion of determinism with a true idea: "The soul that sins, it shall die" (Ezekiel 18:1,4). Jesus said: "The good man out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil man out of his evil treasure produces evil; for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks" (Luke 6:43-45).

History gives us numerous examples of how bad beliefs and thinking lead to bad results. For instance, the Aztecs of Mexico believed that the sun was a living person, a being that required the blood of human victims for his food.
