### ***“My Church, My Gifts, What Now?” #3*** ***You Are Enough***

Introduction:

- We have been studying about spiritual gifts and personal responsibilities that we, as Christians have toward God, each other and His Kingdom.
- Ephesians 4:11-16. Notice that line... ***“each part doing its work”***.
- I have the feeling that many people don't see themselves as important enough or significant enough, or just “enough” when it comes to being a valuable part of the kingdom of God. God sees you differently...Psalm 139:1-16; Romans 8:31-39; John 3:16; Philippians 4:13; Philippians 3:16-21.

\_\_\_\_\_ would always be at the top of any list of God's greatest servants and leaders.

- Exodus 3-4:17.
- Moses looked to God and in essence said, *“God, I am no good to you...I have ruined my life, I have wasted too many years...”* But that is **NOT** the way God saw it.
- Moses would ultimately become one of the greatest leaders of God's people.
- But at first, he didn't think he was enough!

\_\_\_\_\_ is an interesting guy.

- Nehemiah 1-2
- I'm sure Nehemiah might have thought he wasn't enough. After all he was a cup-bearer for the king. He wasn't a wall-builder.
- But he prayed, he got up, he went, He worked, he ignored the critics (and he had them), but God blessed his work and in 52 days they completed the wall that had lay in ruins for 150 years.
- The cup-bearer turned wall-builder was enough...because God made him enough!

\_\_\_\_\_ was a prostitute. She sold herself for *money*.

- Hebrews 11:31; James 2:23-26
- No one would've thought that God could use such a person for His Holy Plan!
- And yet that's exactly what He did (Joshua 2; Matthew 1:1; 5)
- Rahab, no doubt, thought she was not enough...but God saw her differently!

***Close...***

- You are enough! But not without Him...so accept Him today!

***Life Group Questions for the Week Beginning...***  
***Sunday October 28, 2018***

1. When you read verses like we read this morning (Psalm 139:1-16; Romans 8:31-39; John 3:16; Philippians 3:16-21; 4:13), how do these make you feel about how God sees you and how He loves you?
2. Do you or have you ever felt like you were “not enough” or not “good enough” to be loved by or used by God? Do you know others who feel this way? How do we help ourselves and others overcome these feelings?
3. Why was Moses convinced that he wasn’t good enough to be used by God? What do you **THINK** God saw in Moses? (Exodus 3-4)
4. What did Nehemiah do **FIRST** (and for how long) before he went to speak to the King about going back to Jerusalem? (Nehemiah 1-2:5) Have you ever done that?
5. What was Rahab’s “profession”? (Hebrews 11:31; James 2:23-26) Can you imagine the labels that she wore? Has anyone ever labeled you? Have you labeled others?
6. How did Rahab’s faith manage to positively affect her family’s future on two levels? (Joshua 2:15-21; Joshua 6:20-24a; Hebrews 11:31)
7. Why did God use and why does He still use people like Moses, Nehemiah and Rahab to fulfill His will? What does “redemption” mean and how does it play a part in all of this?
