Eben's Essentials

Perhaps the single most important archaeological find ever is the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls. These 800 or so scrolls had been stored in caves by the Essenes when the Romans were advancing to crush the Jewish revolt that started in A.D. 66. Jerusalem and the Temple were finally destroyed in A.D. 70. The scrolls were written from about 250 B.C. to about A.D. 65 and were accidentally discovered in 1947. The Essenes were a sect of pious Jews who developed an enclave in the town of Qumran on the northwest side of the Dead Sea. In addition to scrolls relevant to the Qumran sect, a copy of every book of the Old Testament, except Esther, was found.

Of special significance, is the corroboration of the accuracy of the Biblical manuscripts. For example, a scroll of Isaiah written in 150 B.C., was compared to a Masoretic text of Isaiah from A.D. 916 and found to be consistent despite the 1000-year difference. Skeptics have often assumed that the Biblical text has been grossly corrupted through hundreds of years of copying, but the Dead Sea Scrolls have verified that the Old Testament has accurately been handed down through the centuries.

The New Testament, in II Timothy 3:16-17, states, "All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching for rebuking, for correcting for training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."
