Life Group Questions for the Week Beginning... Sunday November 18, 2018

1.	What do the contrasts in 1 Corinthians 13:1-3 speak to you about love?
2.	Do you remember the three Greek words we spoke of this morning for "love" and what did each mean? Why is this important for our study?
3.	The first part of 1 Corinthians 13:4 speaks of two positive characteristics of love. What are they and what are some practical ways we can show our love for others through them?
4.	What negative effects to body, mind and soul can envy, boasting, pride and rudeness bring?
5.	Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 13:5 that our love is not to be "self-seeking" ("It does not demand its own way" - NLT). How does Philippians 2:3-4 help us understand this principle?
6.	It's quite possible "love is not easily angered" and "love keeps no record of wrongs" may be the most difficult to practice. Why? How does putting the previous qualities into action help us accomplish these?
NOTE : Think about how God has dealt with us on this matter of "Love keeps no record of wrongs". (Psalm 130:3-4; Jeremiah 31:34; Hebrews 8:12; 10:17)	
7.	No doubt "the truth" is important, in fact "love rejoices with truth". But what important element must always accompany truth? (Ephesians 4:15).
8.	List and briefly describe the four things Paul tells us that love ALWAYS DOES (1 Corinthians 13:7).
