Richard's Reflections

Overcoming Distractions, #2

I think Nehemiah was a great leader for God and part of that leadership is seen in his ability to overcome distractions and continuing the work at hand.

Now if Nehemiah didn't already know it, he was about to find out this truth - "*whatever your hands find to do, someone will criticize it!*" There are those who long to hurt, harm and halt the good work any of us would do for God. Notice the immediate response of the enemies of Jerusalem upon hearing that Nehemiah was going to re-build the wall. "*...they laughed at us and despised us...*" (2:19). In chapter four, as the work progresses, Tobiah the Ammonite criticizes with these cutting words, "*Whatever they build, if even a fox goes up on it, he will break down their stone wall!*" (4:3). So how did Nehemiah and his workers overcome this distraction? Notice verse 6 of chapter 4: "*The people had a mind to work.*" Not a "mind to whine" or a "mind to hide", but a mind to work! They kept their focus on the task at hand.

Our focus must also stay sharp - even in the face of criticism. There are many souls to be saved and every minute we stay sidetracked battling back against criticism is time lost that we should be dedicating to the mission of Jesus' church.

And the reason we stick with the work, even through the criticism: "*Because we have set our hands to a GOOD work!*"

Eben's Essentials

We live in a culture absorbed with multiculturalism, religious pluralism, and pseudo tolerance. Christianity claims that only through Christ's atoning death on the cross can we be reconciled to God and live with Him for eternity (John 14:6).

Author Abdu Murray has brought clarity to this issue. Take the saying, "All roads (religions) lead to God." Is that true of all world religions? Many in our society today would say that it is. Islam completely disagrees. In Islam, only if our good deeds outweigh our bad deeds will God save us, and Jesus is only a prophet. In Hinduism, one is not trying to reach God, one is trying to *become* God. In classical Buddhism, there is no self at all and there is no divine being. There is simply the Void and our goal is to become extinguished into the Void. Confucianism is not interested in the afterlife at all. What matters is this life and the social structure in which we conduct ourselves.

Not only are these roads all different, they also claim different destinations. How can all roads lead to God when not all even make that claim? The apostle Peter boldly stated to the Jewish leaders that Jesus Christ is the only name given under heaven by which people must be saved (Acts 4:12).
