Overcoming Distractions, #4

As we have been noticing, distractions just seem to be part of life. They can crop up anytime, anywhere. So if these interruptions of life are seemingly unavoidable, how do we overcome them and keep our focus on Christ and His mission for the church?

I think Nehemiah was a great leader for God and part of that leadership is seen in his ability to overcome distractions and continuing the work at hand. We have noticed how Nehemiah and his workers were able to overcome the distractions of Criticism, Adversity and Idleness.

In conclusion of this series of lessons on Overcoming Distractions remember these simple truths:

- 1) *Whatever you do for Christ is open to criticism. Somebody won't like the way you are doing it (Neh. 4:2-3).*
- 2) *Always keep a mind to work (Neh. 4:6).*
- 3) *Talk to God frequently (Neh. 4:9).*
- 4) *Never allow a great work to be interrupted by the distractions of criticism, adversaries or the idle (Neh. 6:3).*

Eben's Essentials

Our lives are filled with relationships. The primary relationship is with God. All others flow from it. Relationships, as between husbands and wives, parents and children, employer and employees, friends, fellow church members, etc., are the source of much happiness and much pain.

In relationships, there are those who go out of their way to do something for others solely because they think they ought to. A rather common misbelief is that human relationships are simply alliances of obligation - nothing more and nothing less. The New Testament teaches us that two basic obligations exist: To love God and to love our fellow humans. The inferior obligation says, "I *must* because I *owe* it." The obligation of love says, "I *will* because I *choose* it." The inferior obligation says, "I *should* because it is expected of me." The obligation of love says, "I *want to* because I *care*." The inferior obligation says, "I *ought to* because I'm *supposed to*." The obligation of love says, "I *would like to*." There is a big difference between "I *must*," and "I *choose*."

The New Testament way says, "To sum up, each one of you is to love his wife as himself, and the wife is to respect her husband" (Ephesians 5:33).
