Lighting it Up!

The Bible speaks a great deal about *light*. From God's "let there be *light*" statement of Genesis 1:3 to the promise of heaven from God to the saints in Revelation 22:5, "They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their *light*, and they will reign forever and ever," the Word of God is filled with "light" statements concerning the character and holiness of God. In fact, Jesus tells us in John 8:12, that he is "the *light of the world*." But as important as it is to know that God is light, it's equally important to know that he expects us to be light too. "You are the *light of the world...and cannot be hid*" Jesus told his disciples in Matthew 5:16. There is also a very interesting passage in Philippians 2 that should awaken us to the importance of our influence in this world. "Do everything without complaining and arguing, so that no one can criticize you. Live clean, innocent lives as children of God, shining like *bright lights* in a world full of crooked and perverse people" (14-15). It seems clear to me that we reflect the light of God and shine most when we simply seek to do the will of God first. The world will want to criticize you as a child of God, don't give them reason. Continue to shine the light of Christ at home, at work, with friends and among enemies...so that through it all "the *light of the world*" is magnified!

Eben's Essentials

Most of us like to imagine ourselves as heroes or heroines. This is especially true when we are young before time and experience inflicts reality on us. However, comic books and adventure movies never completely lose their appeal. Of course, there are authentic heroes and heroines in the world. In the Bible, King David's heroes were fighters who always charged into battle.

We can read about the exploits of some of these warriors in 2 Samuel 23:16-23. Once when David was thirsty, three valiant soldiers broke through the Philistine lines, drew some water from a well, and brought it back to David. But he refused to drink it. Instead, he poured it out as an offering to the Lord. David said, "The Lord forbid that I should drink this! This water is as precious as the blood of these men who risked their lives to bring it to me." Abishai, the brother of General Joab, once used his spear to kill 300 enemy soldiers in a single battle. There was also Benaiah. He did many heroic deeds including killing two champions of Moab. On one snowy day, he chased a lion down into a pit and killed it. Benaiah also wrenched the spear from a great Egyptian warrior's hand and killed him with it.

God has heroes and heroines today. The Lord's heroes are those who hold on to Him against the current and are always at their post. Is that kind of fortitude characteristic of us?
