When two people interact, there are bound to be differences, for no two people will ever think exactly alike on every issue. This is true of husbands and wives. In our relationships with others, we need a good deal of flexibility. Have you ever known anyone who thinks that he or she is always right and who never compromises? Such a person has a low level of adaptability. A certain person was once described as "the kind of man for whom there are only two sides to any question, the one he holds - and the wrong one." Is he a man of conviction or just stubborn? There is at least one more take on the question.

The person who has self-confidence, who has nothing to feel threatened about in his dealings with others, is not afraid to admit he may be wrong and that there may be other sides to the question. He does not feel the need to go around with a chip on his shoulder constantly defending his own viewpoint.

We need standards and convictions upon which we can build our lives. However, it is good to understand that the inflexible, rigid person is in danger of intolerance and even bigotry. The apostle Paul was a man of strong convictions. Yet, he wrote, "I am become all things to all men, that I may by all means save some" (1 Cor. 9:22).
