Eben's Essentials

What is true love? Seemingly, the only kind of love worthy of universal acceptance is unconditional love (i.e., Godly love). Love, I think, should generally be supported by favorable feelings, but it is not itself *only* a feeling. If it were *only* a feeling, it would be a very fickle reality. True love is a decision and a commitment – you decide to commit yourself to another's growth and fulfillment as a person.

This means that your love may be "tough love," not at all sweet and coddling. For example, if someone is in danger of becoming drunk and he asks you to have a drink with him, the loving answer would be a firm "no." If someone asks you to participate with him in a deception, the loving thing to do would be to confront him and firmly refuse. However, when needed, love can be tender and compassionate.

True love, what the New Testament calls "agape love," is a gift, not an exchange. In Romans 5:8, Paul wrote, "God commendeth His own love toward us in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." The essential message of unconditional love is one of liberation. When we think of conditional love, we may often think of manipulation of others in an attempt to satisfy our own needs.
