The Blessing of the Holy Spirit

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law" (Galatians 5:22-23).

There is no doubt that every faithful follower of God would like to possess all of the character traits listed in the above passage. But just how does one go about obtaining these characteristics? Are some just born with them? Do we work to achieve these qualities? Do we just read about them in Scripture and hope we will learn our way into this behavior?

Certainly, we all understand the concept of a tree that produces fruit. A healthy apple tree will produce apples. But why? Because the limbs which bear the fruit are connected to the main trunk from which all parts of the tree get their supply of nutrients. Apart from the trunk the limbs have no power at all to produce fruit. Similarly, we cannot produce fruit separate and apart from Jesus. "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me" (John 15:1, 4).

So as we see from Scripture, it is the indwelling Spirit who produces this fruit (Gal. 5:22-23) in the Christian. This fruit is not a "work" which we accomplish on our own but rather a fruit produced by the Holy Spirit in us as we "*live in the Spirit*" and "walk in the Spirit" (Gal. 5:25). May we thank God for this great gift!

Eben's Essentials

Education is important and not all of it is obtained in schools. The "school of life" is an often hard but thorough teacher. If we are wise, we will endeavor to be apt learners all of our lives. There is so much to know and most of it is fascinating.

We will, of course, have to choose priorities in our studying and learning. I would not neglect reminding us that the highest study is the familiarizing of ourselves with the Word of God. "The Scriptures are the comprehensive equipment of the man of God, and fit him fully for all branches of his work" (II Tim. 3:17; Phillips translation). This is not to say that other areas of study should not be enjoyed. All truth is God's truth. But I have found, over and over, that the real answers to the profound questions of life are found in the Scriptures.

Our emotions feed off our thoughts. If we feed them positive, self-fulfilling, rational, Biblical thoughts rather than negative, self-defeating, irrational, unbiblical thoughts, then our feelings and behaviors will work for us instead of against us. My thesis is simply that wrong patterns of living develop from wrong philosophies of life. Check out what the Bible says about it in Proverbs 23:7 and Romans 12:2.
