Richard's Reflections

Nothing Else Matters

Paul wrote: *"I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me"* (Gal. 2:20). Paul was in essence saying that Christ is all that matters.

Our entire life will be about Jesus when His message grips us to the point that we understand Christ not only died for sins, and not only died for "our" sins, but He died for "my" sins. This is the life-changing realization that will alter the way we live the rest of our days upon this earth. When you finally realize that Christ died for **you**, a real person with a real name and a real identity - that it was your sins that put Him on that cross, that you are a sinner, and God Himself died for you - this will be the day when you also realize that nothing else matters.

All of us need to make the story of Christ's death personal. When we do, He is all we will be living for. Jesus Christ and Him crucified will be the only message we know. Our doctrine will be Christ, our hope will be His cross, and our passion will be His story and His glory. Nothing else matters.

When people think of us, they will think of Him, because our lives will be so completely wrapped up in Him and His love for us. When you realize that your face and your name were on His mind when He died, that He went to the cross for you, and that He took your sins, your life will never be the same because - nothing else matters.

Eben's Essentials

The book of Psalms consists of conversations with the Holy God. Many people have learned to pray by studying the Psalms. We also need to recognize the musical element inherent in the Psalms. Only as we learn to appreciate the dynamic energy and raw honesty in the Psalms do we become truly and wholly human in Jesus Christ who also read the Psalms. Here, we are dealing with Hebrew poetry.

For an example, let's look at Psalm 1 from the Old Testament. It reminds us of the joy of those who do not follow the advice of the wicked, or hang out with sinners, or join in with mockers. Rather, they delight in the law of the Lord, meditating on it day and night. They are like trees planted along the riverbank bearing fruit each season. Their leaves never wither, and they prosper in all they do. But the wicked are like worthless chaff, scattered by the wind. They will be condemned at the time of judgment, and sinners will have no place among the godly.

According to the Psalmist, God's idea of "going well" is different from ours. He believes it goes well with us when we don't spend all our time in godless people's presence, but rather find our joy in His Word. Then heavenly blessings open up over our heads.
